## 2025 NEA-EC Simultaneous Line Clearing and Tree Planting Activity



### PELCO II, GNPD Seal CSR Partnership for Livelihood Training

PELCO II formally sealed its partnership with GNPower Dinginin Ltd. Co. (GNPD) through a Ceremonial Signing of Partnership held on September 29, 2025, at Luring's Barbeque House, San Roque, Guagua, marking the launch of a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) livelihood program aimed at empowering Member-Consumer-Owners (MCOs) through skills development.

The partnership focuses on the implementation of a Basic Electrical Wiring and Installation Training Program, a livelihood initiative designed to equip MCOs with practical and employable skills. In support of this program, PELCO II coordinated with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) to ensure that participants receive proper training aligned with industry standards.

The ceremonial signing symbolized a shared commitment among the partner institutions to uplift communities through education, livelihood, and sustainable development. This initiative reflects PELCO II's continued dedication to delivering not only reliable electric service but also meaningful programs that contribute to the long-term welfare of its MCOs.



PELCO II actively participated in the 2025 NEA-EC Simultaneous Line Clearing and Tree Planting Activity, last August 15, 2025, joining Electric Cooperatives (ECs) nationwide in celebration of the National Electrification Awareness Month (NEAM). This nationwide initiative underscores the vital role of ECs in advancing the Rural Electrification mission and ensuring the delivery of safe, reliable, and sustainable electric service to its MCOs.

These learning initiatives were held at San Basilio National High School, San Basilio, Santa Rita and Tinajero Integrated School, Tinajero, Bacolor where students actively participated in discussions and learning activities. The sessions provided practical insights into basic electrical concepts while also highlighting possible career paths in the energy and power industry. By bringing knowledge directly to schools,

PELCO II hopes to ignite curiosity, build awareness, and encourage the youth to explore opportunities in the field of electricity. The Academe Program reflects the cooperative's long-term vision of empowering the next generation through education—preparing informed, skilled, and responsible individuals who may one day contribute to the country's growing energy sector.



PELCO II marked another meaningful step in empowering its MCOs through skills development and livelihood support after it successfully conducted the first batch of training for Basic Electrical Wiring and Installation at San Roque, Guagua, Pampanga on September 28 to October 3, 2025.

The five-day training program brought together 25 trainees from Guagua, Bacolor, and Lubao. This initiative was made possible through the support of TESDA and GNPower Dinginin Ltd. Co. (GNPD), ensuring that participants received quality, industry-standard instruction aligned with national competencies.

During the training, they were able to gained hands-on knowledge and practical skills essential in basic

electrical wiring and installation—skills that are in demand across various industries. Beyond technical learning, the program aimed to prepare trainees for sustainable employment and better income opportunities that will greatly help sustain their financial needs. To further strengthen this initiative, PELCO II committed to shouldering the expenses for an additional training phase, enabling the trainees to qualify for and obtain the National Certificate II (NC II). This certification significantly increases their chances of securing employment and building a stable livelihood in the electrical field.

Through programs like this, the



Coop continues to demonstrate its commitment to community development—empowering MCOs not only by providing reliable electric service, but also by opening doors to opportunities.



# Task Force Kapatid: Bayanihan in Every Line



When typhoons battered several provinces across the country in the latter part of 2025, the darkness followed with homes without light, often go unseen, whose courage shines communities struggling to recover, and families yearning for normalcy. In moments like these, hope often arrives quietly, riding on service trucks, wearing hard hats, and carrying tools meant not just to fix power lines, but to restore lives.

This was the mission of Task Force Kapatid, a solidarity initiative spearheaded by the Philippine Rural Electric Cooperatives Association (PHILRECA) and the National Electrification Administration (NEA)—a nationwide effort that brings electric cooperatives together to help one another in times of calamity.

Answering this call, PELCO II, in coordination with the Central Luzon Electric Cooperatives Association (CLECA), deployed its linemen in three batches beginning August 2025, extending help to severely typhoon-hit provinces specifically in Pangasinan, Masbate, Nueva Vizcaya, and Aurora.

For more than a month, these linemen left behind their own families and responsibilities to serve communities far from home. They worked long hours under difficult conditions—braving unstable weather, damaged infrastructure, and physical exhaustion—to hasten the restoration of electricity. Each repaired line, each energized household, became a symbol of resilience and bayanihan.

**They stayed when conditions were tough.**

**They served when communities needed them most.**

**They restored not just power, but hope.**

Beyond the technical expertise they brought, they carried with them the spirit of brotherhood that defines Task Force Kapatid. Their presence reminded affected communities that they were not alone—that somewhere beyond the fallen poles and darkened streets, fellow Filipinos were willing to stand with them until the lights came back on.

This is a tribute to the heroes on the lines—PELCO II linemen whose sacrifices often go unseen, whose courage shines brightest in the darkest times. Their dedication reflects the true essence of public service: selfless, steadfast, and impactful.
